## How we set 2019 prices with our transparent pricing mechanism

In 2012, we introduced a transparent pricing mechanism that accounts for the impact of Open Access (OA) content and its ‘author pays’ revenue. This ensures that we are not paid both a subscription and an article publication charge (APC) fee for the same article. If the percentage of non-OA articles drops so will the price.

First we estimated cost inflation based upon the Retail Price Index (RPI) at 3.6 percent. Then we took account of the recent percentage change in non-OA articles published.

For 2019 prices, we did this by looking at two rolling three-year periods, which were 2014 – 2016 and 2015 – 2017. We excluded paid OA articles in our calculations and also any one-off rises in content to clear a backlog as these are temporary changes. Here a cap of +/- 15 percent protects the subscription prices from fluctuating too suddenly. There were no other economic factors to take into account.
